New Hearing Assistance Units Now Available on Sunday Mornings | Hearing assistance is now available for free during church services. You can choose between an earpiece to amplify sound or if you have a T-Coil switch on your hearing aids, you can use a neck loop to send the signal directly to your hearing aids! Please ask an usher for assistance and the special receiver you will need to use.

Reminder About Receiving Communion | All are invited to the altar rail to receive the sacraments (bread and wine) or a blessing. Bread will be placed in your hand by the priest. If you choose to receive the wine, the preferred (and most sanitary) way is by drinking from the common cup, guiding it by the base to your lips. While our preference is to keep fingers OUT of the chalice, if you plan to intinct, please use hand sanitizer before coming to the altar rail, located in the church.
